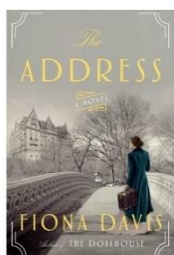

**The Buzz:** I enjoyed learning about the prestigious Dakota apartment house in New York City as told by two narrators 100 years apart.

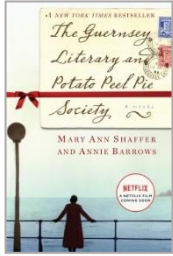


### **Follow Me Back** **By A.V. Geiger**

**The Buzz:** This book was a page turner from start to finish! I never saw the ending coming!

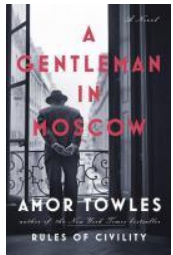

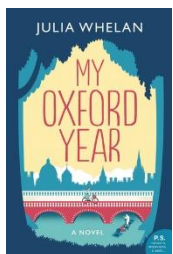

### **A Gentleman in Moscow** **By Amor Towles**

When, in 1922, Count Alexander Rostov is deemed an unrepentant aristocrat by a Bolshevik tribunal, he's sentenced to house arrest in the Metropol, a grand hotel across the street from the Kremlin. Rostov, an indomitable man of erudition and wit, has never worked a day in his life, and must now live in an attic room while some of the most tumultuous decades in Russian history are unfolding outside the hotel's doors. Unexpectedly, his reduced circumstances provide him a doorway into a much larger world of emotional discovery.

**The Buzz:** Count Alexander Rostov is a charismatic, charming and indomitable spirit. His imagination is the only thing that outshines his intellect. Placed under house arrest in the Hotel Metropolitan, "Sasha" reinvents his life in the microcosm of the confines of the hotel.
