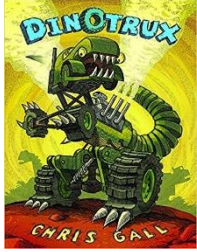

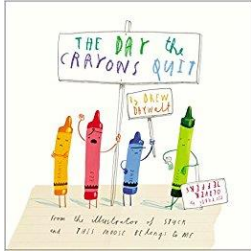


Dinotrux

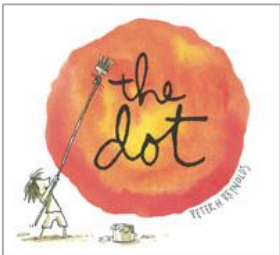


The Day the Crayons Quit

The Buzz: I love the unique illustrations in this picture book and it makes everyone want to become an artist!

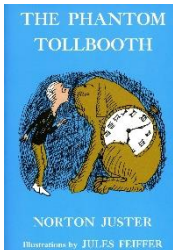


Hello, Universe
