The Merciful Crow

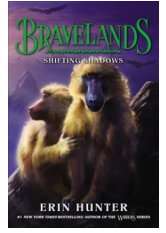

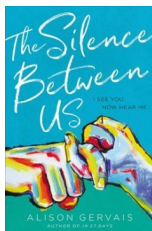
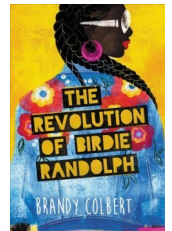
